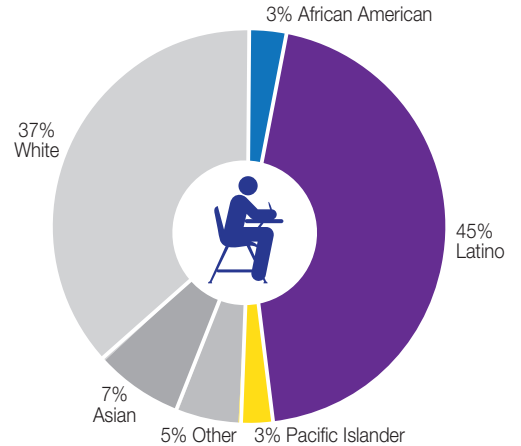


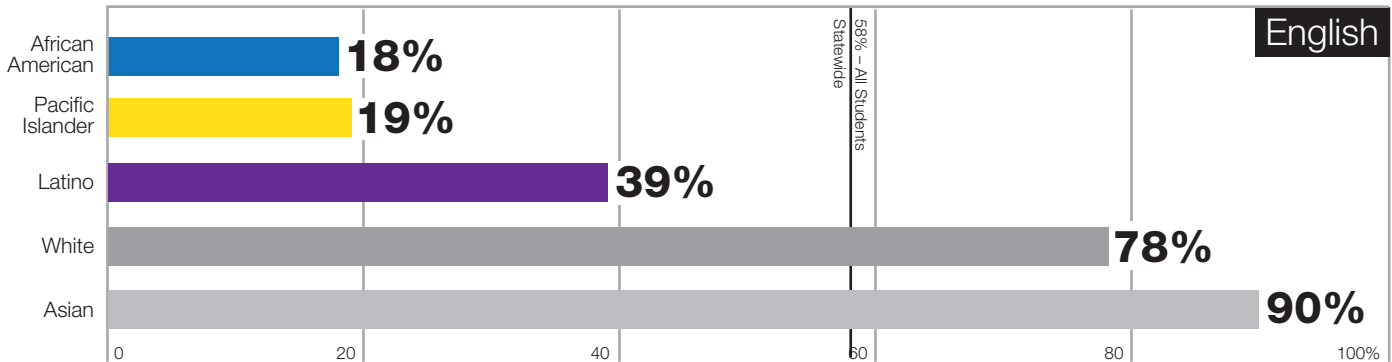
District Student Spotlight

Sequoia Union enrolled 8,665 students in 2015-16.

- This fact sheet highlights Latino, African American and Pacific Islander students in Sequoia Union, as those groups perform below the district average for every performance indicator.
- When combined, these three groups make up more than half of all students in Sequoia Union.
- Of all of the students who graduate from the district, almost half (44%) do not finish high school with the requirements they need to attend a UC or CSU.

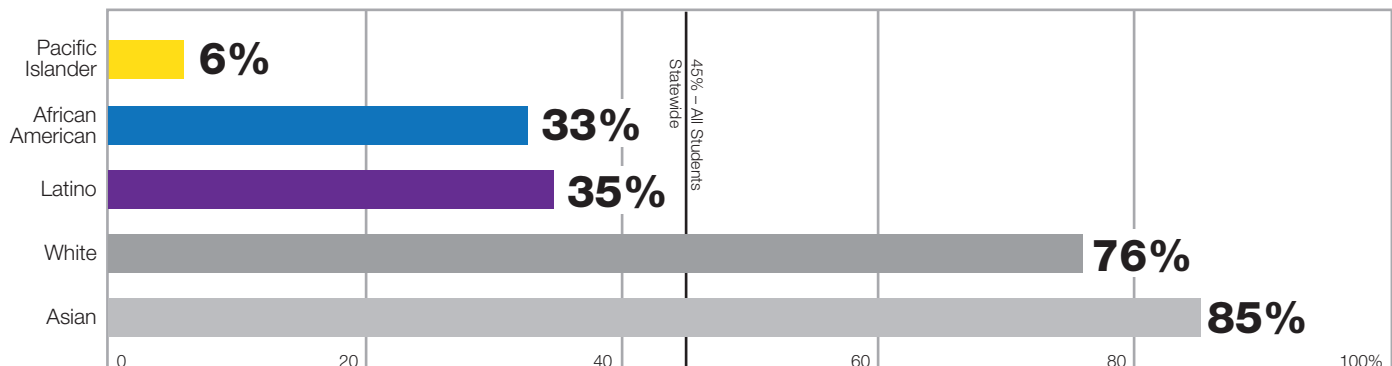


Students Meeting or Exceeding Standards

Percentage of High School Graduates* Who Are UC/CSU Eligible



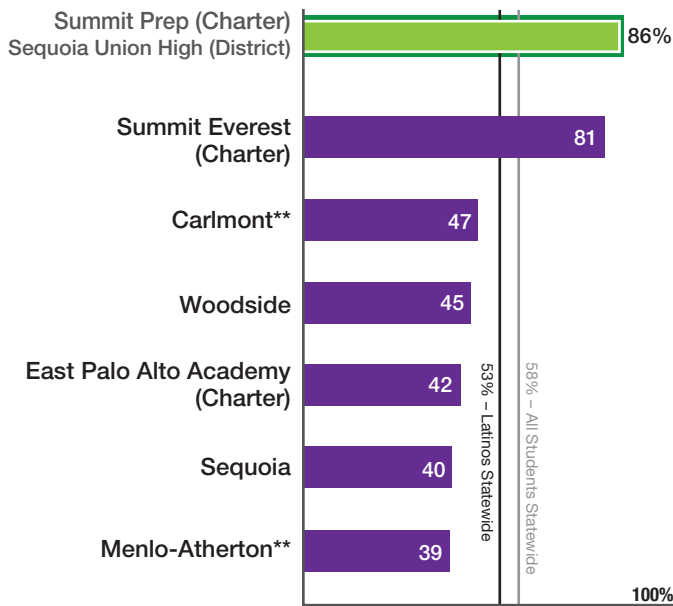

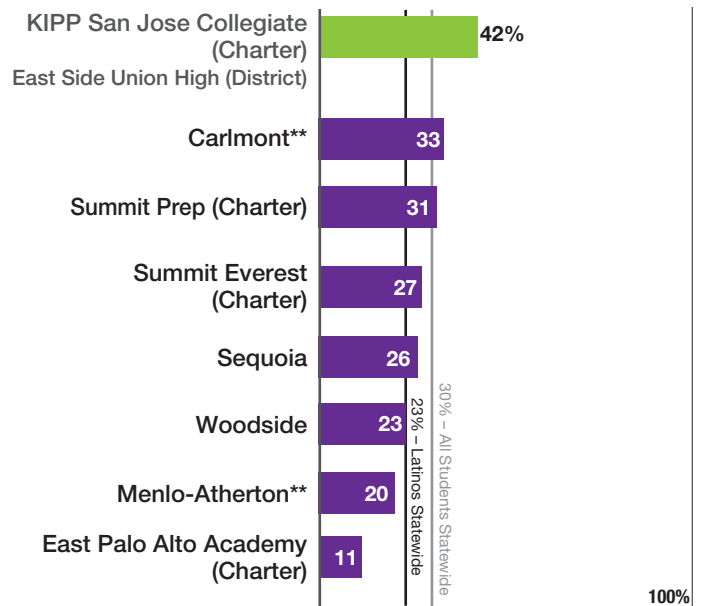
Percent Proficient in Sequoia Union, 2015-16

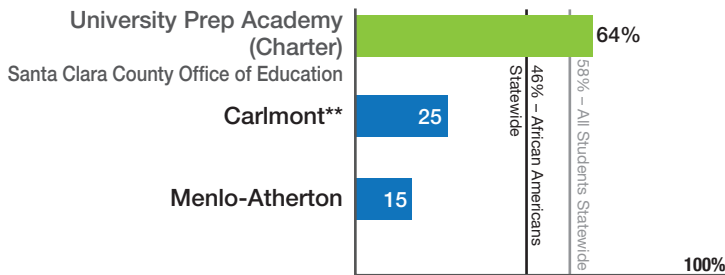

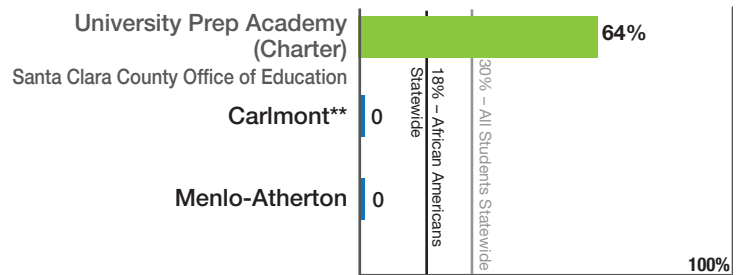

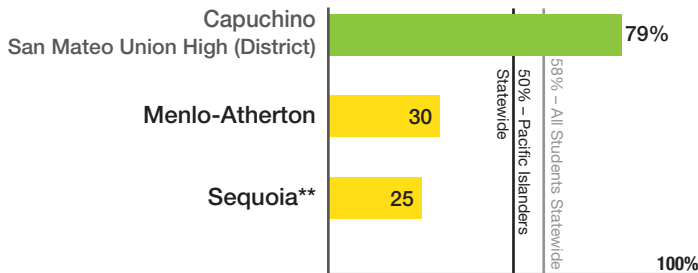

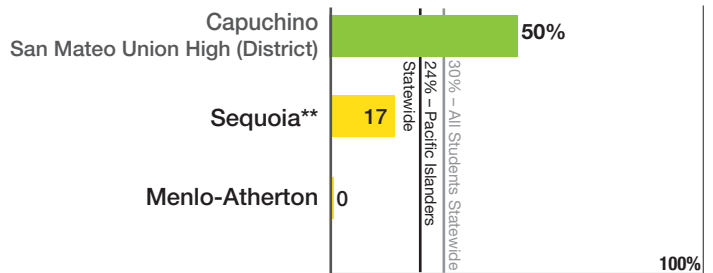
