

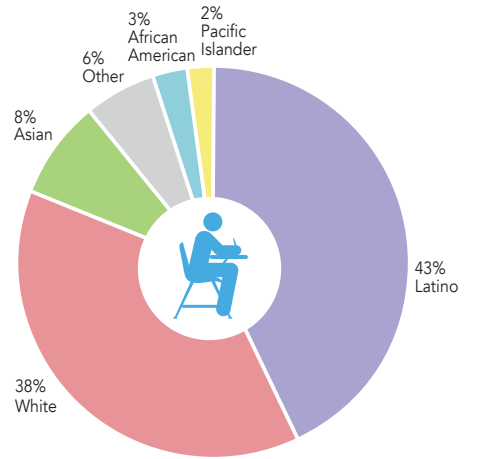


## District Spotlight

This fact sheet shows how students are performing in Sequoia Union High School District (SUHSD) in English and math, as well as the percentage of graduates that have completed the coursework necessary to apply to a UC or CSU.

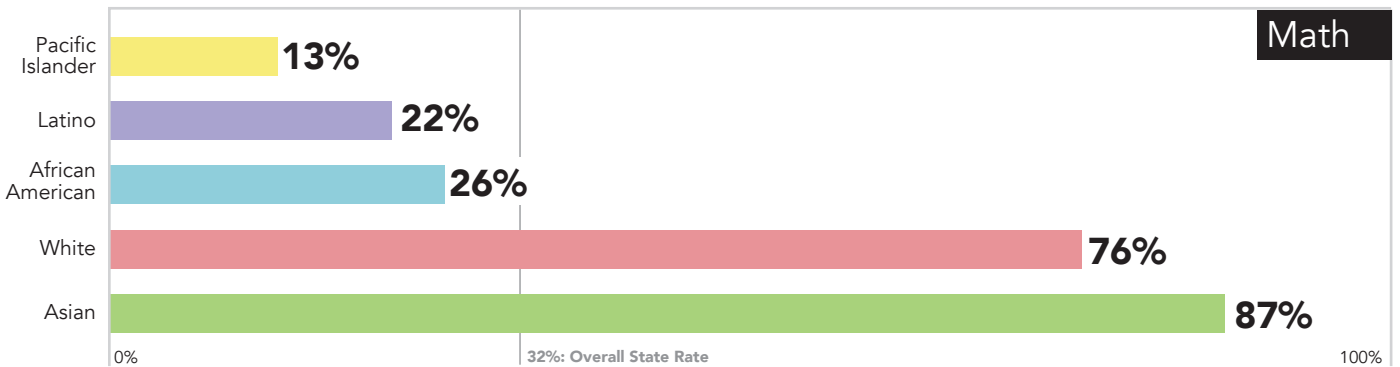
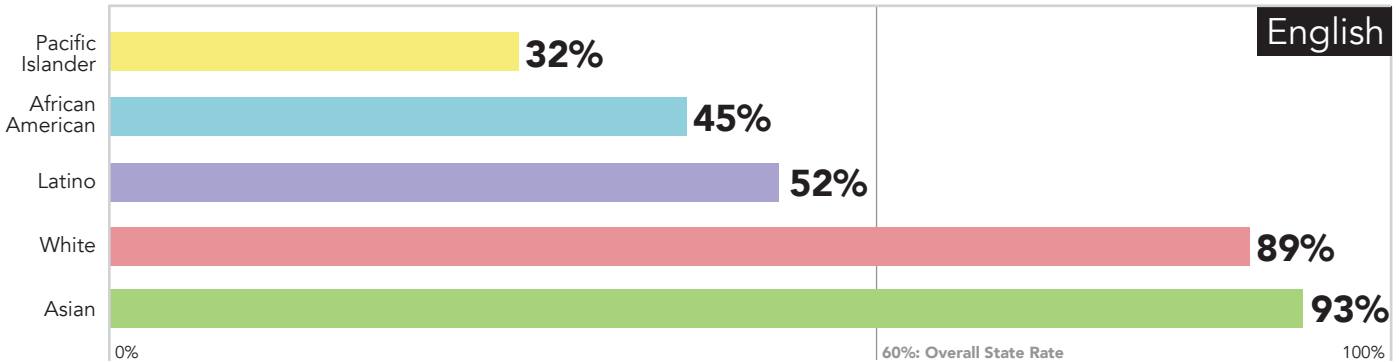
SUHSD enrolled 8,768 students in 2016-17. Latino, African American and Pacific Islander students make up almost half of all students in the district.

White and Asian students make up a sizable percentage of SUHSD, and those groups are performing well above the California average. There are still large gaps, however, in how well the district is doing for Pacific Islander, African American and Latino students.



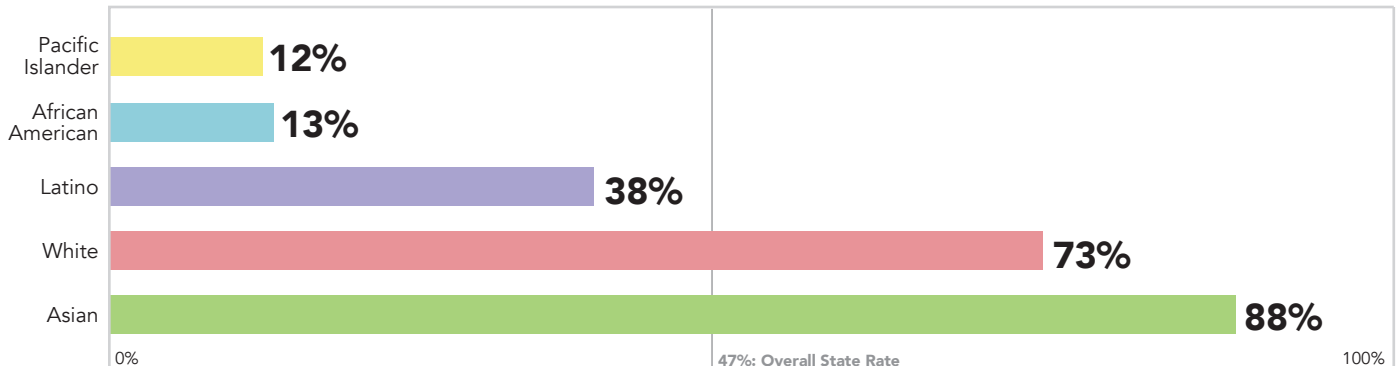

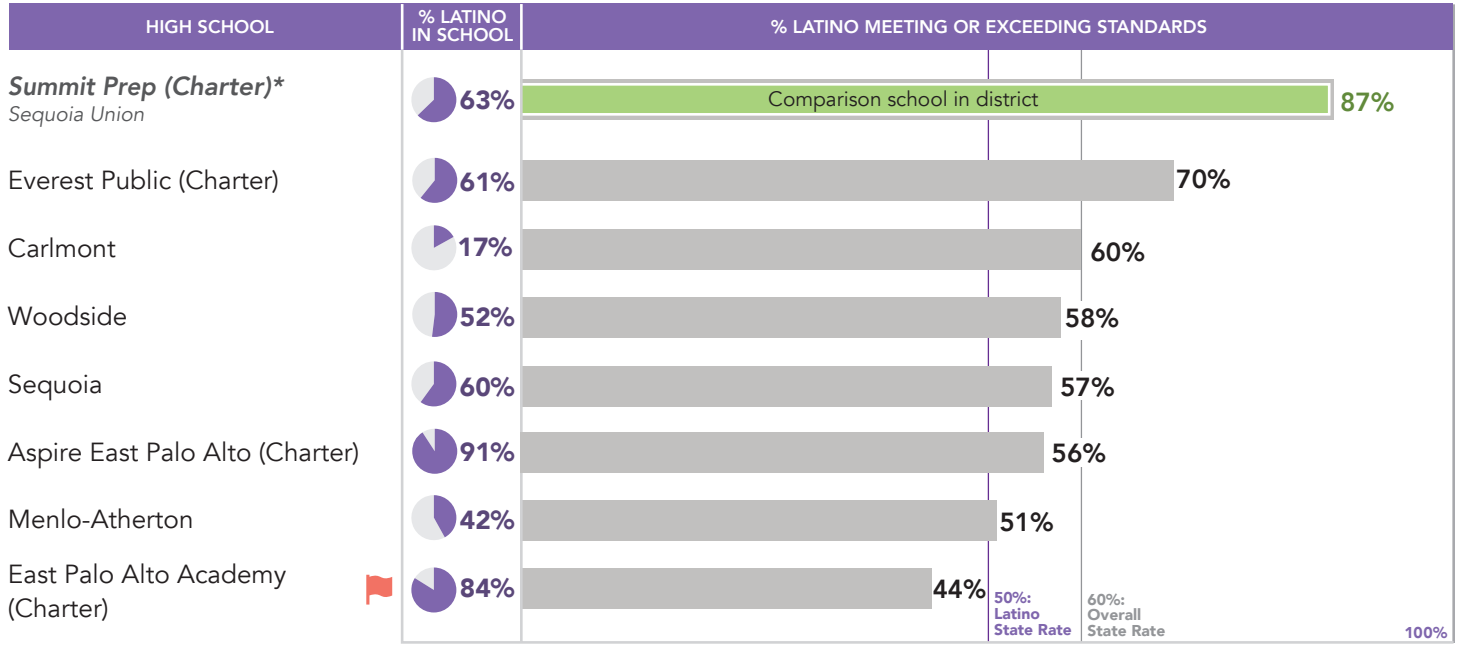
# Latino Student Spotlight

Latino students are the largest student ethnic group and make up 43% of students in SUHSD (3,800 in total). This Latino Student Spotlight includes all high schools located within the geographic area of Sequoia Union High School District with publicly-reported data for Latino students.

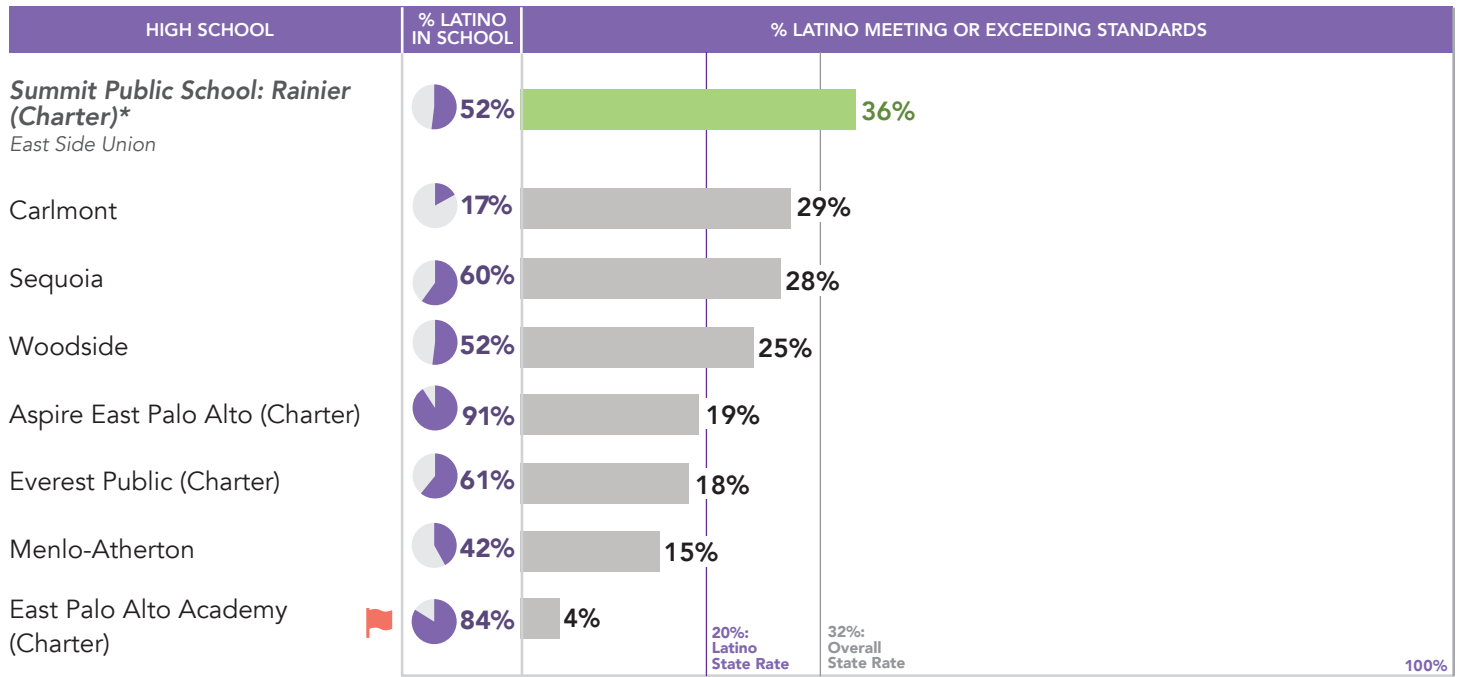
Some other local schools are also included here as a comparison to the schools in SUHSD. These "comparison schools"\* (results shown in green) are local schools that serve a similar population to SUHSD and are achieving high results for this group of students.

For each school below, the pie charts show what percentage of students are enrolled for Latino students. The bar charts show what percentage of students are on grade level.
